FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT.....

I have a feeling that we will appreciate spring this year, if it ever gets here. We were closed 11 days and in addition had numerous two hour delays, resulting over 100 hours of lost learning. Recent legislation granting four additional calamity days, after making up four contingency days, puts us back on course. The Good News: by using three e-days when closed and being in session on President’s Day we will not have to make up any additional days. As scheduled, the last student day is Thursday May 22, 2014 and graduation will be held Sunday, May 25, 2014.

However, we are concerned that with the Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT) staying on schedule we know we lost a lot of instruction. Research shows that for every ten days lost there is a significant drop in student performance on assessments. We should know by the end of May. The state did add one week to the Ohio Achievement Assessments (OAA) testing window, but we still have the deficit of 100 hours of lost instruction. We should know OAA results by the first of July. The later reporting also impacts student retention in the third grade per state legislation on the “third grade reading guarantee”; and a shorter window for remediation.

We will share details in our summer edition of Tiger Talk. Again, please do not hesitate to contact me (pfisterc@wgschools.org or 419-568-9104) if you have ideas, suggestions, or concerns...we want the best opportunities and learning experiences for all of our students.

New Office Security Measure

A new security measure has recently been added to the entry doors in both the Elementary and High School offices. Beginning soon, all office doors at the Elementary and High School will be locked throughout the entire day. Anyone wishing to enter the building during the day will need to be “buzzed” into the office. Several other schools in the area have been using this same procedure for a while and now Waynesfield-Goshen can join them thanks to a grant from the Ohio School Facilities Commission.

An intercom system has been placed at each office entrance featuring a call button. Once the visitor presses the call button, they will be able to speak with office personnel. Office staff will need to clearly identify and see the visitor before allowing them entry into the building. This would apply to any visitor coming to W-G during the school day.

Waynesfield-Goshen Local School District is always looking for ways to be more efficient and effective in our fiscal policies. While it may seem like a minor issue to some, the collection of non-sufficient fund (NSF) checks is a time consuming and costly issue. As with any business, Waynesfield-Goshen Local School District has an obligation to our clients and the community's taxpayers, to be fiscally accountable. Collecting returned checks can take valuable time from the school district personnel. To manage this process, our District began using **checXchange™** on **March 1, 2014**.

checXchange™ utilizes the federal and state laws allowing the electronic recovery of NSF checks which results in a high rate of recovery at no cost to the School District. The cost becomes the responsibility of those who wrote non-sufficient fund checks with the electronic recovery of the face amount of the check and the electronic recovery of the state fee from the bad check writer's bank account. Utilizing **checXchange™** is an effort by the School District to be fiscally accountable in a more efficient and cost effective manner.

Waynesfield-Goshen Local School District will gladly accept checks. No longer will the district or school staff arrange for the repayment of returned checks. Should your check be returned for insufficient funds, you expressly authorize your account to be electronically debited or bank drafted for the amount of the check plus any applicable fees. The use of a check is your acknowledgement and acceptance of this policy and its terms and conditions.

MEALS PLUS - A Convenient Way to Pay

If you currently don't have a Meals Plus account, go to www.lunchprepay.com, to sign up for a free account that allows you to put money on your child's lunch account from your own home! You can use a credit card to apply as much as you want to your child's account eliminating having to send in a check or cash with your child. You can also

view your child's balance and receive emails to let you know when your child's lunch balance falls below a specified amount. All that is needed is your child's student identification number to enroll. If you have any questions, contact the Treasurer, Tonia Hovest at 419-568-9100.

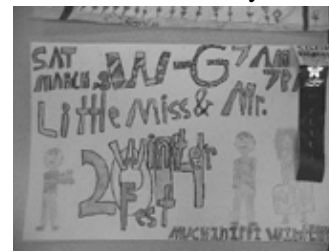
see their amazing projects in the display case, there are pictures of samples on my teacher web page (Mrs. Kiefer). Take a look!

Waynesfield-Goshen Local Schools was well-represented at the Ohio Music Education Association District III Junior High Festival. 8th graders Kaitlyn



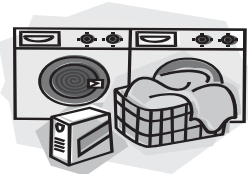
Allen (soprano), Justin Agnew (baritone), and seventh grader, Veda Knerr (alto) were accepted into the Honors Choir; Dawson Carmean

## WG FFA Applies for Awards



Six WG FFA members recently submitted applications for State Degrees, American Degrees and proficiency award to be judged at the state level. WG FFA is proud to announce that all three of the members Kindsey Salyer-Watts, Danielle Heintz, and Brandon Turner who submitted State FFA Degree applications earned the award and will be presented the golden charm of the State FFA Degree at the upcoming state convention held in May. Lee Turners application for American FFA Degree has been passed by the state FFA and will be sent to the national for further judging this summer. Mindi Brookhart and Brandon Turner also submitted proficiency award applications on their supervised agriculture experience projects to be judged and both were rather successful. Brookhart finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the district (the first place contestant in our district is in the top four in the state) with her application based on her work as FFA district and local vice president. Turner submitted three applications for his work in specialty crops, emerging agriculture technologies and turf grass management. Turner placed in the top four in the state in both specialty crops and emerging technology and will be interviewed at the state convention to determine his final placing in each category. He also place first in the district in turf grass management. Applications take several hours of a student's time and a great attention to detail in language arts, mathematics and photography, congratulations to all the applications on a great evaluation.

## WG Ag. Students Build Hydraulic Robots

The Plant Science class recently completed a unit on Hydraulics (the mechanical force of liquid) by building and demonstrating a machine that could contain an egg and move it at least 3 inches and release the egg without breaking the fresh egg. While this sounds like a simple straight forward project it takes some engineering, thinking and building expertise. Four groups competed in the competition judged by the physics instructor, Mr. Kevin Wingfield and Head of Maintenance, Mr. Tim Buffenbarger. The judges chose the machine of Brandon Turner and Caleb Beale as the best mover of eggs but it was noted that this competition was the closest to date because all machines accomplished the task on the first try. 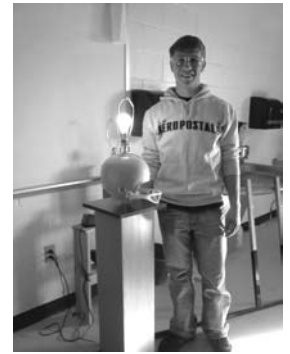
